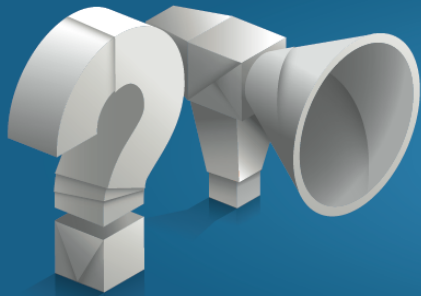

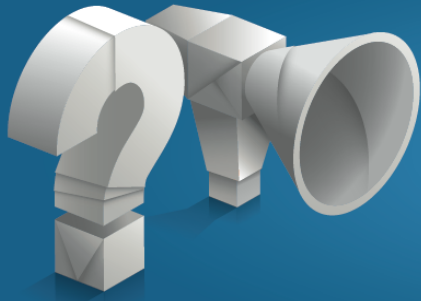

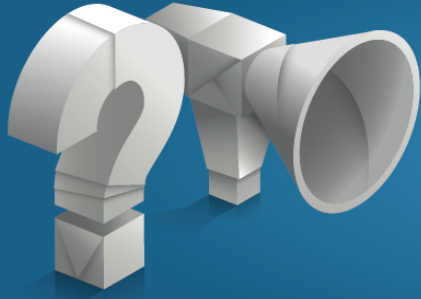

INTERNATIONAL CONTEXT

- ☐ few victims are knowledgeable of the workings of the criminal justice system
- ☐ most victims do not know what possibilities are open to them, where they can receive assistance and what is expected from them
- ☐ information does not reach victims on due time
- ☐ lack of information as a prime source of dissatisfaction with the criminal justice proceedings

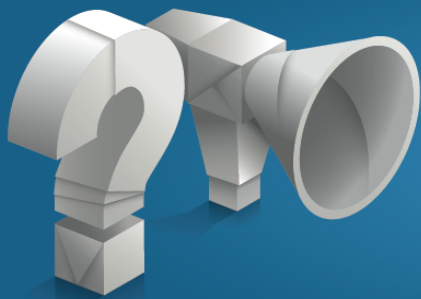

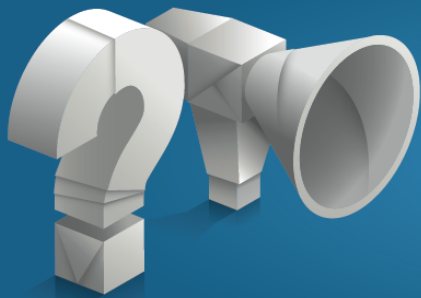
- ☐ very recent law

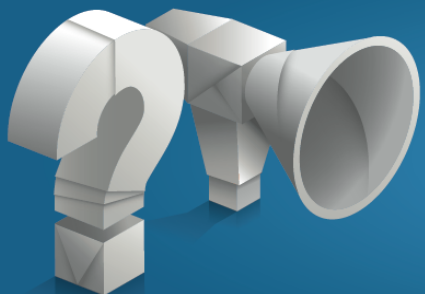

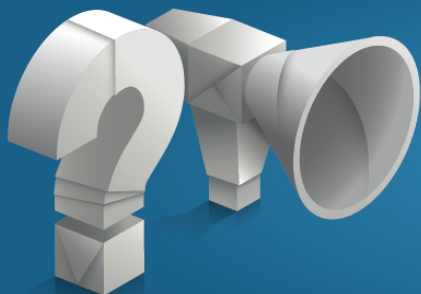

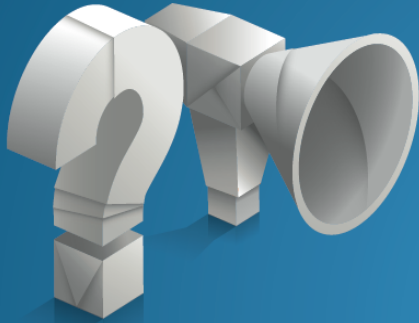
